BUILDING PERMITS – DO I NEED ONE?

If you are considering a building project, please contact the Zoning and Permit Officer to determine what type of permit is necessary for your project. A Zoning permit is required for most work in the Borough even when a UCC Building Permit is not specified.

SANITARY SEWER SYSTEM

1. ***Are there certain items that should not be placed in the sewer system?***

Yes. Only biodegradable items should be placed into the sewer system. Non-biodegradable (solid) items such as rags, disposable wipes, paper towels, shop towels, dental floss, feminine hygiene products, and latex products should not be placed in the sewer system. Please dispose of all non-biodegradable items in your trash, not your toilet. Grease, oil, and chemicals of any sort (including prescription drugs) should not find their way into the sewer system.

2. ***Must I replace broken or missing clean out caps?***

Yes.

3. ***Would I be responsible for repairs to the sewer main due to damage from my open pipe?***

Yes. Missing or broken clean-out caps can result in an open pipe on your property that would allow storm water as well as possible debris and other items to enter the sewer line, perhaps leading to damage, blockages, and back-ups.

WEEDS, GRASS & TREES

All grass, weeds, and similar noxious vegetation growing in the Borough of New Salem must not be allowed to exceed a height of twelve inches.

All trees which overhang public sidewalks shall be kept trimmed so that the minimum clearance is eight feet. Additionally, all trees which overhang the public street shall be kept trimmed so that the minimum clearance is not less than fourteen feet. Bushes, hedges, shrubs, and other ornamental flowers and vegetation must be kept trimmed and not encroach on the vertical plane of any abutting sidewalk or street.

No trees, bushes, hedges, shrubs, other ornamental flowers or vegetation, regardless of height or location, shall be permitted to impede into any clear sight triangle of any street intersection. Finally, please be considerate of your neighbor by keeping your grass clippings on your own property rather than discharging them onto your neighbor's property or onto the sidewalk or street.
